## **PROSPECTUS**

### **THE JESUITS**

The Society of Jesus (Jesuits) is a religious order within the Catholic Church founded by St. Ignatius Loyola and nine companions in 1540. Today there are around 16,000 Jesuits in 112 countries on six continents. Jesuit priests and brothers live in community and do a wide variety of work including in universities and schools, spirituality centres, parishes and missions, the media and creative arts, in prison, hospital and military chaplaincy and working with refugees. Their work in schools and universities began in 1548 when a small group of Jesuits was sent to Sicily to begin a school at the request of the town council of Messina. Other towns and cities followed suit and, over the next two centuries, a network of some 850 Jesuit schools and universities was established across the world. Today, Jesuit schools are staffed largely by people who are not themselves Jesuits but whose work continues and builds upon the 450 year old tradition of Jesuit education. Jesuits, are those who work with us, follow a spirituality that comes from the little book of 'Spiritual Exercises' which St. Ignatius began in 1521. Ignatian spirituality is rooted in the Christian gospel and the desire to give greater glory to God by following Jesus Christ and serving others as He did. It encourages us to be attentive to our lived experience and to discern what is truly good for us and what is not, and to act accordingly. It encourages basic attitudes of gratitude and generosity.

### **JESUIT EDUCATION**

What makes a Jesuit school different or distinctive? Saint Ignatius Loyola (the 16th century founder of the Society of Jesus and Jesuit schools) gave the answer that a Jesuit school should be about "improvement in living and learning for the greater glory of God and common good."

Jesuit education has its core principle of cura personalis –care for each person so that they may flourish academically, emotionally, socially and spiritually. Jesuit schools strive to offer an excellent intellectual formation through outstanding teaching and a Magis curriculum that is as broad and deep as the school's resources will allow, together with a rich offering of extracurricular activities, so that as many as possible each child's interests, gifts and talents are developed.

Magis in Latin means “more” and is equated with ideas as generosity, magnanimity and selflessness. It is further reverberated in the motto of the Jesuits, “Ad majorem Dei gloriam” (AMDG) which means “for the greater glory of God”. St. Ignatius of Loyola would encourage people around him during his time by asking, “what have I done for God ? what am I doing for God? What MORE can I do for God ?”

What MORE do I need to achieve excellence in all things?

Underlying teaching and learning in a Jesuit school is an outstanding pastoral care- teachers and support staffs get to know children very well and step in with challenge, encouragement and support in the ups and downs of growing up. Through links with Jesuit schools and institutions around the world, Jesuits encourage their pupils to have outward looking horizons and perspectives, exploring what it is like to live in very different circumstances and cultures, close to home on the other side of the planet. Jesuit schools strive to give a first class education but they are also places committed to outstanding formation of character, wanting their pupils to develop into well educated adults who will live good and virtuous lives. Jesuit schools hope that the young people here formed, in partnership with parent, will make the most of their God given gifts and talents and use their education as ‘men and women for others’ to make the world a better place, especially for the least well off and most socially marginalised. This twofold emphasis on living and learning is, if you like, the DNA of Jesuit education. Worldwide, the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) is responsible for 1865 Educational Institution in 65 countries, 356 of them being secondary schools. These Jesuit Educational Institutions engage the efforts of over 98,000 teachers among whom over 91,000 lay people – men and women belonging to different religious communities and the rest, members of the Society of Jesus. They educate approximately 17,92,000 students. In India, Nepal and Sri Lanka, the Society of Jesus is responsible for 153 High Schools, 38 University Colleges, 14 Technical Institutes and 5 other Institutes with 8085 lay teachers educating 2,34,338 students belonging to every social class, community and linguistic group.

They are taught through the medium of English and other regional languages. These institutions are part of the Catholic Church's effort to share in the country's educational undertaking.

### **STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES**

The Catholic school is a learning community animated by the Divine Spirit of Love and Freedom, and living the Gospel Values. It shares Christ's concern for the liberation and fullness of life of all peoples, especially of those in greatest need.

In the Catholic school, young people of any religious family find scope within their own cultural milieu to reflect on their lives in the light of their faith and to develop not only in knowledge and skills but also in wisdom which is the fruit of reflection on life and its lessons. As they grow towards human maturity they are enabled with the help of the Divine Spirit and the support of the school to find meaning and purpose in their lives, and are inspired to live and work for the building up of a just and fraternal society.

Jesuit Schools aim at the integral personal formation of the young. To accomplish this, special efforts are made:

- to help the students to become mature, spiritually oriented men and women of character;
- to encourage them continually to strive after excellence in every field;
- to value and judiciously use their freedom;
- to be clear and firm on principles, and courageous in action;
- to be selfless in the service of their fellowbeings; and
- to become agents of needed social change in their country.

The Jesuit School thus aims at making its own contribution towards a transformation of the present-day social condition so that principles of social justice, equality of opportunity, genuine freedom, respect for religious and moral values, enshrined in the Constitution of India, may prevail, and the possibility of living a fully human existence may be opened before all.

## **VISION STATEMENT**

### **SECONDARY EDUCATION VISION STATEMENT OF CALCUTTA PROVINCE**

In the context of emerging social, economic, political and cultural changes, the Jesuits of Calcutta Province in Secondary Education commit themselves in the light of the Gospel values and Ignatian Charism to transform the students into persons of competence, conscience, compassion, character and faith, in collaboration with teachers and parents, for building a better community.

5. To encourage the students to do their best in the curricular and co-curricular programmes leading towards fuller personal growth and transformation.
6. To foster in them skills to live and work in harmony with those who differ from them in religion, caste, language, ethnicity, etc., and in case of conflicts, to resolve or manage them constructively.
7. To form them into spiritual leaders with a social conscience and with a sense of global solidarity.
8. To promote deeper bonding among the staff with a common mission;
9. To reach out to parents and to share with them our vision of education.

## THE PATRON OF THE SCHOOL

The patron of the school is St. Francis Xavier (07.04.1506 – 03.12.1552). Born of a noble Spanish family, Francis became a follower of St. Ignatius of Loyola during his studies at the University of Paris and was one of his first companions. Jesus asked, “What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?” (Matthew 16:26). The words were reiterated to Francis Xavier who was a young teacher of philosophy and had a highly promising career in academics, with success and a life of prestige and honour before him. Francis Xavier, 24 at the time of living and teaching in Paris, did not heed these words at once. They came from a good friend, Ignatius of Loyola, whose tireless persuasion finally won the young man of Christ. Francis then did the spiritual exercises under the direction of St. Ignatius, and in 1534 joined his little community (the infant Society of Jesus). Together at Montmartre they vowed poverty, chastity and obedience to the apostolic service according to the directions of the pope. From Venice, where he was ordained as a priest in 1537, Francis Xavier went on to Lisbon and from there sailed to the East Indies, landing to Goa, on the west coast of India. For the next 10 years, he laboured to bring the faith to such widely scattered peoples as the Hindus, the Malayans and the Japanese. He spent much of that time in India, and served as provincial of the newly established Jesuit province of India. Where ever he went, he lived with the poorest people, sharing their food and rough accommodations. He spent countless hours ministering to the sick and the poor, particularly to lepers. Very often he had no time to sleep or even to say his breviary but, as we know from his letters, he was filled always with joy. Francis went through the islands of Malaysia, then up to Japan, he learned enough Japanese to preach to simple folk, to instruct and to baptize, and to establish missions for those who were to follow him. From Japan he had dreams of going to China, but this plan was never realized. Before reaching the mainland he died. His remains are enshrined in the Church of Good Jesus in Goa.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION OF THE SCHOOL**

St. Xavier's School, Burdwan established in February 1964, is an English Medium School run by the Society of Jesus (Calcutta Jesuit Fathers). The aim of this institution is to impart sound moral, intellectual and physical education to the young. Great care is taken to form the character of the pupils, to train them to become all round personalities: self reliant, capable of taking initiatives, and possessing a leadership of service.

## 4. ADMISSION

1. Application for admission in Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary Sections must be made to the Principal only. Any effort at seeking admission through dubious means - such as offering a donation will debar a student from getting admission.
2. Regular admission is to the L.K.G. section only. The candidate should be 4½ years old.
3. Application Form for admission will be available on the dates announced on the school notice board.
4. THE DATE OF BIRTH ONCE ENTERED IN THE ADMISSION REGISTER WILL NOT BE ALTERED FOR ANY REASON. Care, therefore, must be taken to furnish genuine documents at the time of admission.

5. All those candidates who have previously attended another school must produce original Transfer Certificate.
6. Application from parents at the beginning of a school year to place their wards in a class / section of their own choice shall not be entertained.
7. The Principal's decision is final in all matters of admission.
8. Admission to class XI is not automatic, it depends on the students' behaviour, academic performance and at the discretion of the Principal even for the students who have completed the ICSE at St. Xavier's School, Burdwan.

The ISC is a separate course. A new application is required for admission to this course. The criteria or the cut off percentage will vary from year to year, depending upon the overall results of the students in the relevant subjects in the ICSE Examination.

## **5. RULES FOR PAYMENT**

- a. The school fees cover 12 calendar months.  
No reduction is made for holidays or broken periods.
- b. Fees under any head of payment may be subject to an increase at a later date. In such circumstances parents will be duly informed.
- c. Yearly extras must be paid with the monthly fees of April.

3. The Unit System is followed in all classes. Briefly, the system divides the syllabus of each subject into clearly defined blocks of related matter, e.g. one or two chapters of a textbook. As soon as the matter of a particular unit has been completed in class, the student is assessed.

4. **A pupil who misses an examination or Unit Test may not appear for them at a later date. If the absence is justified, the fact will be taken into account when deciding on promotion. Parents must not send their children for a Unit Test /Examination when they are ill or recovering from an illness. No student will be allowed to leave the school just after the Unit Test or any Examination without completing the school hour. No student/guardian will approach the teachers for re-test.**
5. Before and after any Major Holidays i.e. the last day before closing and opening day of the term, there will be a Unit Test.
6. The students absent from class the day before a test will not sit for the test unless allowed by the Principal / Vice Principal.
7. Computer, Education is provided to all the students of classes L.K.G. to 8. Its objective is to introduce computer as a tool to supplement and expand the learning experience through the use of educational and logic building programmes with an emphasis on learning through play.
8. Marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and indiscipline issues (2.5+2.5).

## DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

1. Students are reminded to address their teachers and all the members of the staff with due respect and politeness. On their way to and from the school they are expected to behave in a proper manner. On class days, all the students must wear their uniform neat and tidy.
2. During the change of periods or when going from one classroom to another, silence must be observed.  
During the class hours, students must avoid talking in the corridor and running while going to another class room.
- 3.a) Students who have been absent from class must have the reason entered in the regularity record stating briefly the cause of the absence. Reasons of private nature may be submitted in a letter.  
b) **If a student is absent from class for more than 10 working days without information his/her name is liable to be struck off the rolls. They have to be re-admitted in case they intend to join classes.**  
c) To be admitted to the classroom, those who have been absent must show the teacher-in-charge their 'Regularity Record' duly countersigned by the Principal/Vice-Principal.

- d) Students who have been absent from class due to an illness exceeding 2 calendar days must bring a letter from their parents. A medical certificate & Doctor's prescription must be attached to the letter.
- e) Late comers will not be allowed to the class without the permission of the Principal/Vice-Principal.
- f) No leave of absence is given without a previous written application from the guardian.
- g) Absence from class for the following reasons is strongly prohibited:
  - i) for birthdays, marriages, feasts, excursions
  - ii) in view of anticipating or extending school vacations
  - iii) in order to study
- h) Those with less than 75% ATTENDANCE will not be eligible for promotion or for the ICSE/ISC Examinations. For every unauthorized absent day, 0.25 mark will be deducted from the total.
- 4. Students should not leave the school premises without the permission of the Vice-Principal/Principal. In case of emergency, a student will be allowed to go home only with his/her father or mother.
- 5. Only with the express consent of the Principal, may parties, picnics, exhibitions be organized, money collected, books, stamps, tickets sold or purchased. The school is not responsible for any privately arranged outing or Picnic.
- 6. Books are regularly issued to the students from the school library. Magazines and books other than textbooks or library books must be submitted to the Vice-Principal for approval.
- 7. **Students should not carry Mobile Phones, smart watches and other expensive electronic gadgets with them and if found, they will be confiscated and will NOT be returned.**
- 8. **Every student must develop strong work habits and independent learning skills. Students must prepare their daily lessons at home, revise the subjects taught each day and complete their assignments, projects and homework in time. (Cls 9-12) : If the project in a subject is not submitted (in time), no marks can be allotted for the Semester Examination of that subject.**
- 9. When co-curricular activities, class picnics or excursions are organized by the school, students have to take part in them.
- 10. **A student who is found guilty of using unfair means during tests and examinations shall be liable to be disqualified and debarred from appearing three consecutive examinations including the one where he/she was found using unfair means, for the first time. If a student repeats the same in any class while he/she is in the School will be dismissed instantly.**
- 11. English must be spoken in the school premises. Those not willing to abide by this regulation will be asked to leave the school.

12. Students whose presence, in the opinion of the Principal, is not beneficial or whose application is unsatisfactory or whose parents /guardians show little interest in their progress, will be requested to withdraw from the school.
13. Keep the campus clean. Do not litter food/waste materials in the class room / School campus. Use the dustbins. Plastic/Polythene packets / pouches are strictly forbidden. Writing on the wall or on desk must be avoided by all means. Offenders must pay adequate compensation for damage caused.
14. Fine will be charged for any damage caused to the school property as per its value, labour cost and fine.
15. It is part of the educational policy of the nation to direct students to take part in social and national service in order to build their character, bring home the dignity of manual labour and develop a sense of responsibility. Social Service projects are organized occasionally and consist of programmes of social uplift outside the School Campus. This project involves the students of classes 7 to 12 and expose them to the socio-economic reality of their less fortunate brothers and sisters.
16. Games and sports are an integral part of the school curriculum. If a student is selected for the school or class teams his / her attendance at practice is obligatory. School games must be given preference over other personal activities. Physical Training classes are directed by experienced instructors.
17. All students are to abide by the school rules and regulations and obey the school authorities and their delegates.
18. Other rules or alterations to the above rules may be issued from time to time by the school authorities.
19. If anybody steals, he/she will be rusticated with immediate effect.

### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTS / GUARDIANS**

1. In all correspondence, kindly mention the student's full name, class, section, roll number and Registration number. All correspondence should be addressed to the **Principal only**.
2. Parents should inform the School Authorities if the child is suffering from any serious illness, chronic ailment, physical handicap or sensory defect (e.g. heart disorder or epilepsy, asthma). In case of chicken-pox, measles, mumps, COVID or any other such contagious diseases, the parent is advised to maintain a prescribed quarantine period before the child is sent back to the school. Stern action will be taken against those who fail to follow the above.

3. Leave of absence for serious family reasons must be applied for in advance in writing. Parents should avoid taking students for functions during working days. Students absent for more than 2 days must inform the school authorities in writing.
4. PARENTS / GUARDIANS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO VISIT THE CLASS ROOM OR INTERVIEW THE TEACHERS DURING CLASS HOURS OR MEET THEIR WARDS DURING LUNCH / TIFFIN BREAKS EXCEPT WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE PRINCIPAL / VICE-PRINCIPAL.
5. Students are supervised in the campus during school hours. The school will not bear responsibility for students not taken home after class hours by 2.00 p.m.
6. In case a child falls sick/meets with an accident in the school premises he/she can be helped with immediate first aid only. The parents will be informed and they are expected to come and attend to the student immediately. It is important to give the correct contact numbers in the diary and update it whenever there is a change in the address of the parents. In severe emergency on consultation with the parents, the child may be taken to the hospital of the parents' choice or to the nearest hospital to avoid delays in providing medical aid. The school will not be liable to bear the cost of any treatment.

#### **CORRESPONDENCE**

In all correspondence kindly mention the student's full name, class, Section, Roll Number and School Registration Number.

#### **WITHDRAWAL, TRANSFER AND DISMISSAL**

- (a) Notice of withdrawals must be given in WRITING to the Principal. One month's notice must be given or a month's fee paid before a pupil may be withdrawn from the school. No Transfer Certificate will be issued unless all dues are fully settled. Pupils who fail to return to the school within a week of the re-opening of the New Academic Session, will be struck off the rolls unless the reason for their delay is intimated IN WRITING to the Principal.  
Cost of transfer certificate is Rs. 500/-
- (b) A student failing in a class at the end of the academic year does not remain on the rolls unless the parents / guardians notify the principal in writing, within 7 days of the proclamation of the annual results, that they wish their child to continue his or her studies in the school.
- (c) A student who fails in TWO CONSECUTIVE CLASSES or TWICE IN THE SAME CLASS will have to withdraw from the School.
- (d) Students whose conduct is INJURIOUS TO THE MORAL TONE of the School or incompatible with strict discipline are liable to be dismissed. In particular, stealing, restoring to unfair means during tests and examinations, and any form of verbal, written obscenity or behavioural acts of violence may entail dismissal.

## CERTIFICATE

A minimum of three days' notice must be given in writing for the issue of Character Certificates, Age Certificates, Concession Forms, etc.

Staff and students are strictly not allowed to upload videos / photos / post comments / remarks that are derogatory and objectionable in the social media.

## VALUE EDUCATION

Value education classes are an integral part of the curriculum. A minimum proficiency in these subjects is a requirement for promotion.

## TRANSPORT

The school does not provide transport facilities to the students.

## POCSO

For the sole purpose of this policy, there shall be 'one campus one redressal mechanism' to deal with protection of children and vulnerable adults from abuse and maltreatment. The redressal mechanism shall consist of the Provincial, Disciplinary Authority and Internal Grievance Cell. Any complaint/grievance involving abuse must be reported in writing to the chairperson of the Internal Grievance Cell or directly to the Disciplinary Authority.

### **SAFETY OF CHILDREN AND STAFF**

1. The safety, security and wellbeing of the children are the highest priority for the school and shall be given utmost importance at all times by all stakeholders including staff, teachers, parents, guardians, students themselves.
2. The Child Protection Committee is set up to safeguard the children in their formative years. The Committee consists of a management representative, staff representative, a lawyer/medical doctor, a parent and a counsellor.
3. Child Protection Officers are appointed to make a study of the problems that the students face in the school and peer groups. The names and contact details of Child Protection Officers are publicised for all so that any intervention may be provided as necessary.
4. Any student who wishes to come forward for any support or guidance is welcome to do so. Any parent or guardian or third person who wishes to raise any issue on child safety may also do so as per the Child Protection Committee procedures.
